

Ctrl/Cmd • Outline • Pixel Preview • Presentation Mode • ruler origin

1. **Rulers** (____ + R) run along the top and left of the document window. Drag from the corner where they meet to reset the _____ (the document's 0,0 point) anywhere you like.
2. **Guides** are non-printing reference lines you drag out from a ruler. Turn on **Smart Guides** and Illustrator will pop up its own temporary alignment hints as you drag objects near each other.
3. A **Grid** (View > Show Grid) tiles the whole artboard with evenly spaced lines. Turn on **Snap to Grid** to have objects jump to the nearest line.
4. View modes change how your artwork is *displayed*, not how it's actually built:
 - _____: shows only the wireframe paths, no fills or strokes. Useful for finding an object hidden behind another.
 - _____: previews how your vector art will look once rasterized to the pixel grid (handy for screen/web work).
 - _____: a fullscreen, no-interface slideshow of your artboards, in order, great for presenting to a client.
